Hat Creek Wildfire Reforestation Lassen National Forest, California

Covering more than 1 million acres in northeastern California, the Lassen National Forest contains 92,000 acres of old growth Sierra Nevada mixed conifer forests. Unfortunately, the forest has been plagued by the same droughts that have affected much of California, heightening wildfire risk.

Between 2012 and 2014, numerous wildfires swept across the Lassen National Forest, damaging old growth forests, displacing forest dwelling animal species and damaging vital watersheds. To respond to the fires, the Forest has initiated an aggressive reforestation plan in 2018. In the spring of 2018, the Forest plans to plant seedlings across hundreds of acres that were affected by the fires.
